The Perinatal Program includes group prenatal care. Group prenatal care is medical care received during pregnancy with other pregnant people. Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program:

The Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program provides families with a community-matched Breastfeeding Peer Counselor, BFPC. The BFPC educates families prenatally, in their home about how to prepare for breastfeeding.
